



Vicki Lynn Wilson – Fortress

At age 16, Vicki Lynn Wilson began a three-year apprenticeship to bronze and stone sculptor, Retha Walden-Gambaro. This experience continues to inspire the themes present in her work. Wilson has exhibited in GWW before, most recently in 2016-2018, and her work is in the permanent collection of several Northwest collections, including the Oregon Zoo and the City of Portland. Fortress showcases Wilson's incorporation of the figure, which she sees as "a pedestal and an entry point; a support for a material investigation." Wilson incorporates Clinker bricks in her sculpture. Clinker bricks have a charred appearance and irregular shapes and textures; the result of the wet bricks being placed too close to a hot fire. Clinker bricks were often rejected by brick manufacturers because of these irregularities, but embraced by artists and architects.
